Bill received his Catholic education at Holy Cross School, in Classon Point in the Bronx, New York, followed by Mount Saint Michael Academy, from which graduated in 1954. He was ALL CITY in both Football and Track while at the Mount. Bill remained in the Bronx for college attending Fordham University on a full Track Scholarship and was selected as the outstanding track performer in his senior year. The Army was next for Bill spending 2 years on the Brooke Army Medical Track Team, winning the 4th Army Track Championship both years.

In June of 1963, Bill married his neighborhood sweetheart, Josephine Clarke. They have 3 children: a daughter, Joanne, who also won a 4 year track scholarship to Fordham University; His namesake, Bill and another son Steve, both Stepinac alumni.

Bill joined Archbishop Stepinac's Faculty in 1960, in the Physical Education Department, and became the Head track coach. He is now in his 35th year at Stepinac! Among Bill's most cherished accomplishments are the setting of a National 2 Mile Relay record in 1963, and winning back-to-back 2 Mile Relay Championship of America at the Penn Relays, and setting a New York State 4 Mile Relay record.

Bill continues his love of running, competing in the Master's Track Program in the "over 40 Years" category, setting a National 1000 yard record, and was the National Champion in the 600, 1000 and 880 yards. Bill finished 3rd in the World for the 440 yard race. In May 1992, Bill was inducted to the Catholic High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame, an elite group of only seven members. Bill is truly a deserving member of Archbishop Stepinac's Hall of Fame.

When Bill was asked to share a few words, he humbly responded "God has been good to me, allowing me to serve Him by working in a field I love so much."
