William F. Plunkett, Jr. is an attorney, founding partner, and president of Plunkett & Jaffe, P.C., with law offices in New York City, White Plains, and Albany, New York.

Bill served as the Director of the State of New York Mortgage Agency from 1982-87. He was the Chairman of the New York State Council of Governing Boards from 1986 to 1988 and has been a member of the New York State Commission on Independent Colleges and Universities since 1993 and a member of the MTA Inspector General's Advisory Board since 1984.

Bill serves as Metropolitan area Chairman for the Malta; is the Chairman-Designate of the Westchester County Association; Chairman of the Westchester Equity Fund and the Westchester Housing Forum.
